The most significant event of my summer happened a couple weeks ago when I attended the 2024 National Youth Gathering in New Orleans, Louisiana. Nineteen of us from the three ELCA churches in Valley City joined some fifty-plus youth from across North Dakota as we set out on a thirty-two-hour bus ride to the Gulf of Mexico. This would be the fifth National Youth Gathering I have attended with youth over my years as a pastor so you would think I would know just what to expect. But each trip is unique because the people are different and so am I. I knew the girls who were attending from Faith Lutheran well, but I did not know many of the other youth from Trinity and Our Savior's, but after thirty some hours on a bus together you get to know each other a little bit better.

A highlight for me was when we stopped at the Civil Rights Museum in Memphis, Tennessee. The museum was built around the Lorraine Motel where Dr. Martin Lutheran King Jr. was shot and killed. The motel remains exactly like it was in 1968 including vintage vehicles in the parking lot. As I walked through the museum, I took in the plight that African Americans went through as they were brought to the United States as slaves and the racism they endured over the centuries. The museum was noticeably quiet with no joking or laughter, I could feel the weight and seriousness of the institution of injustice. I was able to sit next to a statue of Rosa Parks on the bus and when I entered the room resembling the Lincoln Memorial in Washington D.C., I watched Dr. King deliver his I Have a Dream Speech, and was brought to tears. This set the tone for the things I would encounter at the Youth Gathering.



The Gathering itself was a week filled with attending worship, interacting with people from various ministries and missions, attending the three-hour nightly mass gathering with music, dancing and dynamic speakers, all alongside sixteen thousand *Gen Zer's or Zoomers* as they are called. What impressed me the most about these young people was how they handled themselves amongst all the programs and events, all the while walking for hours in 107-degree heat index with 100 percent humidity. The young people did not complain but instead were excited about anything and everything. In a culture that discounts this age group for spending too much time on their screen and being disconnected from those around them, I found quite the opposite to be true. No longer am I the young hip pastor I used to be and these *Zer's* included me in their conversations and activities for the entire week like I was just one of them.

I think my highlight was witnessing 16,000 youth get excited about their faith. The energy they put into singing and dancing, the seriousness and contemplation they showed for the speakers and the kindness they showed each other and strangers on the streets of New Orleans was something I will carry with me for a long time.

I'd like to thank the church council for supporting this trip, for all those who gave toward the fund raisers and for Wendi's hard work in planning and leading the trip. But most of all I'd like to thank the young people for sharing a week of their lives with me giving me the assurance that the future of the Church and our faith is in good hands. We are planning a presentation to share with the congregations sometime soon, but until then, when you run into our young people who attended the National Youth Gathering, take a moment to ask them, not just about their trip but also how they see God working in their lives and in the world, you will get a glimpse into the future of our faith.

God bless you this August and may you see the Lord working in your life and the world bring new life into dark places of our lives.

### Mission Team News



The Mission Committee will meet Tuesday, August 6 at 5:30pm and we will gather the school supplies on that night. See the lists and the bulletins and July newsletter of supplies needs and please continue to bring your school supplies to the church until August 6. Thank you for the supplies and monetary contributions you have provided. We provide these to the teachers who use them for their classrooms.

The Summer Grocery Store is in the final week, and we are still collecting food for the shelves. We thank you for the food already donated as the store has been used weekly. Since we do receive food from Great Plains Food Bank, their process of recording the food distribution is to record household numbers and then we weigh the food and record the pounds of food given out each Wednesday.

I thought it might be interesting to share some of those average numbers. The store has been open for seven weeks and we have had from 17 households in an early week to 31 households in a recent week, with average of 25 households each week over the 7 weeks and an average of 106 total people each week. We have also distributed over 5,000 pounds of food for the 7 weeks, which is an average of 725 pounds of food each week. depending on the number of people in the household and the items available each week, my experience when I was there, is that they left with a large box or two boxes for a larger family for the week. With the Great Plains Food Bank, food donations and monetary donations the grocery store was well stocked each week by volunteers and Backpack board members.

Again, thank you for all of your continued support for this Summer program and the Bridges Backpack program that supports feeding our children throughout the school year. Stay tuned for more information to come as that program continues for the upcoming school year.

As our Mission group brings these hunger awareness needs to Faith members and as I brought the good donations to the grocery store, I couldn't help but think of all the Bible verses and stories we have heard of Jesus feeding the hungry and teaching us to take care of others. This statement came up on some of reading about hunger. When you feed others, you are feeding Christ! Thank you all as you continue to support the Faith missions.


