Do not speak evil against one another... James 4:11

The Commandment that get the least attention is eighth. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. The reason we neglect to pay attention to the Eighth Commandment is because we do not like to admit we talk about our neighbors far too often. Luther said this about the Eighth Commandment in his explanation in the Small Catechism: we are to fear and love God so that we do not tell lies about our neighbors, betray or slander them, or destroy their reputations. Instead, we are to come to their defense, speak well of them and interpret everything they do in the best possible light. Can you imagine if politicians were to follow this commandment, how different the election experience might be.

The sad fact is we too often, not only gossip about our neighbors but in doing so we judge them. We cannot change politicians from saying bad things about their opponents, but we can try to keep the eighth commandment ourselves. Here are some tips on How To Avoid Gossip.

- 1) Determine whether it qualifies as Gossip.

 Gossip involves one party speaking about the other to a third party. The person who is the topic of Gossip is not participating in the conversation. The tone of the conversation is often secretive or negative. The facts expressed in the conversation are often unsubstantiated and have been obtained second or third hand.
- 2) Read James 4:11 or Titus 3:2 Do not speak evil against another.
- 3) Interject yourself into the conversation politely.

 Ask the Gossiper if they have spoken directly to the one they are gossiping about. If not, politely ask why?
- 4) State the facts.

 Gossip withers in the face of truth. Try to separate what is true and what is conjecture. State out loud that gossip is disrespectful and unfair.

5) Offer an alternative explanation based on the truth.

Describe other situation that place the Gossipee in a favorable light. Always try to give people the benefit of the doubt.

Caution: there is a fine line between helping and meddling. Pay close attention to your motivations. Gossip injures both the gossiper and the person whom rumors are being spoken about.

As you consider the relationships you have with your *neighbors* this October, remember the Eighth Commandment and the advice from Luther. And pray that you do not gossip about your neighbor or fall victim to someone gossiping about you.



Respiratory Season Clinic

City-County Health District will be administering Influenza high-dose and conventional Flu vaccinations as well as COVID-19 vaccinations on Sunday, October 6, 10:30-11:30am in the Fireside Room. The flu vaccinations are available for ages 6 months thru adult. Ask them about RSV and Pneumonia vaccine for adults. You must bring your insurance card—Medicare Part B (or other Medicare Advantage Plan), Medicaid, BCBS, Sanford Health, Preferred One, Medica (not Select Care) or Health Partners/Cigna cards with you and these entities can be billed. CCHD cannot bill any other private health insurer for adults. Those who have other private insurance will need to self pay, and a receipt can be3 issued upon request for possible reimbursement by your insurer.


