
Pastor's page

My summer has been pretty ordinary apart from the colossal storm. But ordinary is not necessarily a bad thing. Robert Wicks wrote an article entitled Embracing

the Ordinary, the spirit of ordinariness invites each of us to follow the will of God by trying to find out what our inner motivations and talents are and then to express them without reserve our selfconsciousness. This is true ordinariness. In a world measured by how productive and effective we can be we do not often value the ordinary. Yet it is in the ordinariness of life that God speaks to us. Vincent Van Gogh once said, the best way to know God is to love many things. That begins with accepting ourselves for who we are. If we are to love others, we ought to simultaneously love ourselves and allow ourselves to be deeply loved by God. Remember Jesus said, the kingdom of God is within you. Luke 17:21. We do not appreciate the beautiful ordinariness of our lives. We have all been given gifts that we often discount because we compare ourselves to others. When we believe that Jesus has proclaimed to us that we are accepted, forgiven and loved children of God it gives us the self-confidence to grow and be more resistant to the assaults of failure and criticism. It's not that we forget or deny our faults, rather we are better able to put them in perspective instead of being crushed by them. when we appreciate the presence of God in our own ordinariness, we become more open to finding God in the ordinariness of others. When we are grateful to God for how God created ourselves, we find the confidence, desire and ability to embrace others especially during the most difficult and conflictual times.

We are living in a time of conflict and mistrust. Jesus calls us to live in the image of God. God who is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.

This August, how about we look for the presence of God in the everyday ordinariness of our lives. We do not need to be extraordinary for God to love us or for us to be loved by others. We worry about whether or not we are liked, respected, or as good as other people why can't we just embrace our ordinariness and accept ourselves and others for the way God created us. Wick wrote, *true ordinariness is tangible holiness*. Let's take some time for ourselves with what is left of our summer and trust that in our ordinariness God is truly present.




