Welcome to the season of Advent! Advent is a four-week season in the church where we prepare for the coming of Jesus both as well as his second coming.

We begin advent on the fourth Sunday closest to November 30th (St. Andrew's Day) and it lasts until Christmas Eve. We use this time as an opportunity for spiritual preparation, reflection and anticipation as we await the celebration of Jesus' birth.



When I was a boy, I remember in Sunday School we were always given an Advent calendar to take home and use during Advent. The calendar had little windows we would open, each with a suggestion of one thing we could do to help others. For example, write a card to someone who made a difference in your life or shovel your neighbors walk for free. The Advent calendar made an impression on me, so much so that each Advent season I look forward to opening my annual Advent calendar every day.

The Advent wreath first appeared in Germany in 1949. a Lutheran pastor created it out of a wagon wheel for children. The wheel's circle reminds us of God's unending love and eternal life. Beginning this Sunday, November 30, we will have our Church Advent wreath up in the sanctuary and will light a candle each Sunday as we prepare for Christmas. You can also have your own wreath at home if you like and count down Advent with us. The first week is the Candle of Hope accompanied by the reading of Isaiah 9. Week two is the Peace Candle with Isaiah 40. Week three is the Joy Candle (Sheperd's candle) with Matthew 2 and finally Week four is the Love Candle with John 3.



As we count down the weeks and days until Christmas let us remember that this time is not just about shopping and Hallmark Christmas movies, it is a time for us to remember that Jesus came down from heaven to dwell with us and will one day he will come again. *Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call him, Immanuel, which means God with us.* Matthew 1:23

Come celebrate the Advent season with us at Faith Lutheran Church as we prepare for the coming of the Christ child.




