Ash Wednesday, March 5

We begin our forty-day journey with Ash Wednesday. The Ash Wednesday worship service will be at 11 6:30pm. The service will include Holy Communion and the Imposition of Ashes.

The services during Lent will be live-streamed on our Facebook page: Faith Lutheran Church Valley City. We will also have a freewill offering simple meal served prior to the services, 5:30-6:15pm.



Lenten service will be Wednesdays at 6:30pm and should be 30-45 minutes. The theme for this Lenten season is "Majoring in the Minor **Prophets**". Hear different pastors share the stories of the Minor Prophets in the Bible. The pastors participating are Rev. Jamie Desai (Faith), Rev. Nicholas Rohde (Our Savior's), Rev. Diane Krumm (Trinity), Rev. Rich Kramer (Our Savior's). They will rotate each week to a

different church. Ash Wednesday and Holy Week each pastor will be at their home church.

Meals During Lent



Antan We thank the groups who have signed up to prepare the food and serve for the Wednesday Lenten meals. Thank you for your willingness to volunteer to help with this! We will serve 5:30-6:15pm each Wednesday

during Lent and Maundy Thursday. The confirmation youth are to help with the dishes and clean up.

One of Faith's members asked me this week, "Pastor Jamie, what are you giving up for Lent?" Giving up for Lent? Ordinarily I have not given up anything for Lent because of my stubbornness with my Catholic relatives who always let me know what they are giving up for Lent and I reply to them, "I don't Have To give up anything for Lent because I'm Lutheran!"

However, after my conversation with a Faith member I've given is some thought. I could give up something under three conditions.


- 1) I'm not doing it because I Have To.
- 2) I'm not doing it for *spiritual* reasons.
- 3) I'm not doing it just for myself.

The tradition of giving something up for Lent was a way to symbolically sacrifice a pleasure, mirroring Jesus' forty days of fasting in the wilderness before his crucifixion, thus demonstrating self-discipline and focusing attention on faith in preparation for celebrating Easter. It was a way to reflect on Jesus' temptations and test our own ability to resist worldly desires and set our hearts toward God. That is the idea anyway. Will it work? For some. Will we be able to make our sacrifice for the whole forty days? For some. Will it help us to spiritually focus on Jesus and loving our neighbor? Yes it will!

Then I've decided I will either give up something or do some other action during the forty days of Lent, which will begin *March 5th at 6:30pm on Ash Wednesday*. On Ash Wednesday I will also give you some ideas on it to discern if you would like to join me in *giving up* or *adding to* something this Lent. I will reveal what I gave up for Lent at the conclusion of the forty days (hopefully I make).

What do you say? Will you join me in this Lenten experiment? Do you think you can make it a whole forty days? I'm asking you to give it a try with the hope that it might help us as individuals, families, and a congregation to prioritize our spiritual life and deepen our connection with God.

Come join us for supper at 5;30pm and worship at 6:30pm on Wednesdays this Lent and discover what it means to deepen our relationship with Jesus.
