

Lenten services will be Wednesdays at 6:30pm and should be 30-45 minutes. The theme for this Lenten season is **"UNBOUND: Longing for Wholeness"**.



What if the opposite of being bound is being whole? Our world is filled with things that hold us captive. These things that bind us prevent us from living the whole, abundant life that God has promised us. Through the stories of regular people encountering Jesus, and being drawn to the wholeness that Jesus provides, we can learn about our own longs and be drawn into wholeness.

Each week we will have different pastors sharing scripture and a longing to bring us closer to Jesus. The pastors participating are Rev. Jamie Desai (Faith), Rev. Nicholas Rohde (Nome-Fingal-Kathryn Parishes), Rev. Diane Krumm (Trinity), Rev. Jared Carson (Our Savior's), Rev. Bryce Blank (Epworth United Methodist). Ash Wednesday and Holy Week each pastor will be at their home church.


