The little girl decided she would help the butterfly, so she took a pair of scissors and snipped off the remaining tip of the cocoon. The butterfly emerged easily but its body was swollen and its wings shriveled. The little girl watched and waited



for the butterfly's wings to expand and fly away. But that did not happen, instead the butterfly wasn't able to support its weight and unfortunately spent the rest of its life crawling around with a swollen body and shriveled wings, never able to fly. What the little girl didn't realize in her excitement to help the butterfly was that the butterfly needed to struggle through the small opening itself to force fluid from its body to its wings to ready itself to be freed from its cocoon.

Sometimes struggles are necessary for new beginnings. God does not magically take away the obstacles and struggles in our life to get us to where we need to be. If we didn't have those struggles it would cripple our progress. Without the struggles we would not be a strong as we could have been. And we would not be free to fly.

My prayer for you this January as you start a new year is not to be drug down by your struggles but look at them as an opportunity to grow even stronger, knowing that Jesus does care and is waiting for you to share those struggles with him. And may the outcome of your struggles make you strong enough to meet the next challenge in your life.



Faith Lutheran Church—Celebrates 40 Years

Faith Lutheran was officially formed when First Lutheran and Nebo Lutheran joined together on January 12, 1986! That day the Nebo Lutheran and First Lutheran congregations each walked and met on the corner of the Public Library and all walked back together to what was to become the newly united church. We met to choose a name for the newly merged church. Paul Vangerud and Martee Lunde, along with others, tallied suggestions that our members thought would be the best name for our new church. The number one name on those little pieces of paper was FAITH! It is a name we can all be proud of, no matter what our history. It took faith by those two older congregations to become one and to start anew. Our two congregations in essence adopted each other on that day.

Paul Vangerud was the chairman of the First Lutheran (Norwegian church) negotiations committee and Rich Raymond was the chairman of the Nebo (Swedish church) negotiations committee. After two years of negotiations it was finally approved by both congregations in 1985 to become one

congregation. The First Lutheran church building became the home of Faith Lutheran. The Nebo Lutheran church building has since became the home of several different church congregations.

Rev. Tom Peterson, the first called pastor for Faith Lutheran, wrote in our 25th anniversary reflections booklet:

"What I remember is that we cared for each other and that meant we worshipped together, we cried together, laughed together, and chose to walk together".


