

In these days of the breakdown of community and political polarization, we are asking ourselves, "What does it mean to BE the Church"? In an attempt to understand what it means to be a follower of Jesus today; we turn back to the Book of Acts where it all started with the first Christians and what defined them as a community.

The first century Christians had four essential practices that defined them as the newly formed Christian community: 1) Apostles' teachings 2) Fellowship 3) Breaking of bread 4) Prayer. In a culture where we are surrounded by people who do not necessarily believe the same things as we do, it is crucial that we understand what we believe. Therefore, as the first followers of Jesus did, we too devote ourselves to the teachings of the apostles.

Fellowship, Christianity is not an individual religion, we are called *The Body of Christ*. During COVID we experienced what it was like to be separated from each other and we are still dealing with gathering back together in person without the fear of being in contact with one another. To be *The Church* however we need to be with each other.

Breaking of Bread, in the breaking of the bread we commune together with God through worship which is vital in these times of confusion. Together we: Receive the Body of Christ, the Forgiveness of Sins, Proclaim the Lord's Death until He Comes Again and Remember Jesus.

<u>Praver</u>, in praying together we; Give ourselves to God, Receive God fully, Praise God, Plead for Mercy and Justice and Listen to God's Voice in our Lives.

It's time as a Church that we recover a sense of faith in God and realize that faith is more than just an intellectual assent to believing what's right. The time is urgent to gather together in Christ-like community remembering what it means to be followers of Jesus in this day and age. Christ is calling us to be the community that he intended us to be by devoting ourselves to the apostle's teachings, fellowship, breaking of bread and prayer.

Let us join together in our Faith community to break down the barriers that divide us forming a community that models that of the first followers of Jesus so that the world might know us by our love.

RENEWING OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH THE EARTH

Since, hopefully, spring has arrived Cheryl Foell would like to share this Daily Grace devotion from the WELCA's website:

We know about the three Rs: Reduce, Reuse, Recycle. But "reduce" can no longer be where our efforts begin. I invite us all to Rethink, Revisit and Refuse.

We must "rethink" our overly affluent consumer lifestyle. Rethink how we mass-manufacture and mass-produce. Rethink our purchases by considering the product's origin and packaging.

Then, "revisit" our values, our beliefs, and what it is that we truly need. As Luke 12:15 reminds us, we'd "take care [and be on] guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions."

Most powerful, we'd "refuse" - refuse to be an uneducated participant in a dominate consumer culture that mounts millions of landfills. We'd refuse to squeeze nature out just so we can have a larger home, a closer parking lot, an additional tennis court or the most beautiful golf course.

Rethink. Revisit. Refuse. Then Reduce. Reuse. Recycle. Let's renew our relationship with God's earth.
