As one season comes to an end and another begins, I've been thinking about forgiveness. It is hard to move on when you have unresolved issues with someone. Therefore, I thought this might be a good opportunity to share with you some words of advice from scripture and Jesus himself on the practice of forgiveness.

Forgiveness is one of the highest spiritual practices there is in our faith. Swallowing our pride and seeking the greater good when someone has wronged us is difficult but it leads to healing and growth.

There are five Biblical ways in which you can practice forgiveness:

- 1) Acknowledge that God forgives you.

 When you accept that God has already forgiven you for all the crazy things you have done, it's easier to forgive someone else. God continues to forgive us *sinners* throughout our entire lives.
- 2) Check out what Scripture says about forgiving. Jesus taught his disciples who were hungry to be like him that forgiveness was central to becoming his follower. Read Matthew 6:9-15.
- 3) Go to the person who offended you whenever possible.

 Decide that you will personally deliver your words of forgiveness in person. But note this may not be wise in all cases, in some cases it might make matters worse. Ask a friend or me what would be the best means of forgiveness.
- 4) Say 'I forgive you' out loud.

 Speaking words enacts a physical chain reaction that can create healing in both of you. Jesus used words of forgiveness from across the room when he healed the paralyzed man.
- 5) Pray that you will be able to forgive this person.

 Forgiveness is a force in and of itself, especially in cases that are beyond your control. Forgiveness does not depend upon them feeling sorry or asking for your forgiveness. It's hard to forgive without the other person participating, but in the long run it's for the best.

God bless you in this season of endings and beginnings. Consider Jesus' word this month from the Lord's Prayer, 'Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us'.

Noisy Offering—Access for All



We will be receiving a noisy offering on Sunday, September 15. The offering received will be going to the Access for All Program. This program provides free services for students in need of professional clinical counseling. The kids will come around during the Children's Word with their pails to collect your loose change and dollar bills.

In August we received \$239.64 for the Bridges Backpack Program! Thank you for your generous giving.

Bridges Backpack Program

Childhood hunger impacts our community. Many children in our school district qualify for the federal free and reduced lunch program; however, on weekends many of these children struggle with hunger. Since the fall of 2014, we have purchased and provided meal kits to elementary students. The child-friendly, weekend meal kit included three meals and snack items. We use the donation funds received to purchase these kits from Great Plains Food Bank. There are no income qualification to participate in our programs. In partnership with the schools, volunteers from churches and community deliver the weekly kits and school teachers or staff discreetly put them into the child's backpack on the last day of school each week. This is how we got the name Bridges Backpack Program!

To participate in this program, the child's parent/guardian contacts the child's school to enroll.

In 2017, the Hi-Liner Pantry was established for Jr/Sr High age students. The Hi-Liner Pantry provides food and essentials in the pantry at no cost to the students and they may also request a weekend backpack. Inquiries for pantry use are made through the offices, teachers or counselors who coordinate the distributions.


from Washington School and parents then pick them up from Faith.
