pastor's Lent has begun. The contemplative and reflective season beginning on Page Ash Wednesday and concluding with Easter. We began with ashes on our foreheads on Ash Wednesday hearing the words, Remember you are dust and

to dust you shall return. Lent reminds us that God is not through with us or the world yet. Amid all the evils in the world we are drawn toward the resurrection and restoration of the world.

We join together on Wednesdays with a meal at 5:30 and worship at 6:30. Our theme is *Turning* the World Around: Bible Anti-Heroes and Villains.
