



pastor's December marks the beginning of the church year. We call this season Advent, the season of preparing and waiting. In Advent we prepare for the coming of Jesus on Christmas. Have you begun preparing for Christmas? The challenge

for people of faith during this season is to not to be overcome by the culture's expectations of the season.

The metaphor for Advent is expectation. As Mary is expecting a child, she waits for her child to be born, not only *her* child, but the Savior of the world. As a man I can only imagine what it is like to have a life growing inside a womb expecting the birth of a child. The challenge of Advent is balancing all the expectations of the season while keeping our focus on the birth of the Christ child Jesus.

Let me give you three suggestions that might help you keep your focus on Christ Jesus this season. One helpful activity would be doing an Advent calendar. I remember opening the little boxes on our family Advent calendar as a child and how it was an exciting build up to Christmas as it kept us centered on Christ. A second suggestion would be to begin reading one chapter a day from the Gospel of Luke. Luke has twenty-four chapters so if you begin December first, by the time you get to Christmas Eve you will have read the entire Gospel. You will be surprised by how reading Jesus' life story prior to Christmas will add a whole new meaning to the season. My third suggestion is to set up a Nativity scene in your home. Place a candle in front of the Nativity. Choose a time each night to light a candle and simply stare at the Nativity for a few minutes. You will be pleased by how this ritual will spiritually center you on the meaning of the coming of our Savior into the world.

Happy Advent and please join us for worship Sundays during this season of expectations and preparation for the coming of the Christ child.


Message from Our Council President

Mission Team News

The Mission Committee met in November to plan the Christmas missions we bring to the congregation each year.

We will have the **Christmas Family Giving Tree** (new name, previously Angel giving tree). We have worked with the VC elementary principals for families who could use a little extra help during the season. We will have our Christmas Family Giving Tree up with two Ornaments on the tree for each child: one a clothing wish and one a toy idea Giving or for an older child a personal idea, such as bubble bath, hair ties or fleece blankets or Tee" other fun personal items. We will also be including two ornaments for each family which will be gift cards to be used for the family. Mission members will be at the Tree the following Sundays: **December 3 and December 10** to hand out the ornaments and answer any questions. This year we have 44 Ornaments for gifts on our tree. The **wrapped** gifts are to be returned by Sunday, December 17.

Another Christmas mission we offer this year is collecting for SMP Heath-St. Raphael Christmas gifts given to residents. The items we will collect include gripper socks, sweatpants, sweaters/ cardigans, men's undershirts, men's socks and of course candy regular and sugar free. The **UNwrapped** items can be dropped off in the collection box at church by **Sunday**, **December 17**.



Mission Christmas Our third is the Mission Christmas Fund and we should explore how long we have been doing this as it has been many, many years. This is a collection throughout the year and in December, we help families that are experiencing something difficult. Some of the situations we have helped families or individuals with are travel expenses for medical appointments, long term illness with loss of employment, and many other struggles that we may have known. We help with gift cards for gas, groceries, general shopping needs, a restaurant/pizza, distributing based on their greatest need. The funds are from offerings and donations we receive from the congregation, memorials, and other committees, including, WELCA, Men's Group and Endowment Foundation. Thank you to all who find it in your hearts to help bring the message of love and caring for each other, especially during the Christmas season.
